





How does one know they are in need of mental health services?

Often times, people are aware something is 'off' or 'wrong', but are either unable to understand what they are feeling or do not want to address it based on the negative stigmas attached to mental health treatment. However, mental health treatment is as important as your physical health!

Mental health treatment is eclectic in the fact that there are multiple avenues that one can engage in to receive mental health services. For example, there is inpatient hospitalization, partial hospitalization programs, residential programs, intensive outpatient programs, community therapy, group therapy and private practice. While this is not an exhaustive list, these are common forms of treatment for mental health. Each level of mental health treatment has the goal of treating the individual where they are and for whatever they may be struggling with. Determining the appropriate level of treatment is key, although it can be a process. An effective way of determining the appropriate level of treatment is by a consultation with a mental health professional and, further, a mental health assessment. Assessments provide detailed information about a client's history, presenting problem, diagnostic measures, treatment recommendations and more.

NEED MENTAL HEALTH **SERVICES**

How do I find treatment that is right for me?

In cases of life-threatening emergencies, it is recommended to call 911 or go to your local emergency room. In other cases, one might not know exactly where to start. One way to start could be contacting a mental health professional for a consultation and expressing to them what you are experiencing. They would then be able to recommend an appropriate level of care. In most cases, you would need to be seen for a mental health assessment which would further provide recommendations for your treatment. Advocating for yourself is important because you are aware of your experiences, your thoughts, your feelings and how it is impacting you. When advocating for yourself, keep the following in mind: communicate your symptoms/thoughts/ feelings/experiences in an honest and forthcoming manner, educate yourself on mental health, be open to the journey and process of treatment, ask questions, and know your rights.

How do I find the right mental health professional for me?

When searching for a mental health professional, you need to consider a few questions: what specialties does this professional work in, have they worked with clients before who are experiencing what you are experiencing, what is their therapeutic modality (if you are looking for something specific), what would a session with them look like and more. Some people also consider gender, race, age, etcetera in the search for mental health services; while these considerations matter and are important, remember not to cancel out an opportunity that may actually be positively impactful. An important reminder is to never feel the pressure to continue with a professional you find is not the right fit for you. This is your journey!

What does therapy look like?

Disclaimer, every mental health professional is different! However, you should expect to be heard and have the space to process (this can be different for each professional) through your struggles, learn coping skills and ways of moving forward. Expect to be held accountable, but given grace in a nonjudgmental manner. I want to encourage you all, no matter how big or small your issue may be, invest in your mental health and seek services that will be positively impactful for your growth, well-being, relationships, and overall, your life!

CYBERPATRII

According to the National Center for Education Statistics, Georgia did not report having any virtual schools or required cyber learning in 2013/2014. By 2019, ninety-five percent of education involved some type of cyber technology, such as computer software usage or virtual learning. Five years seems like a short amount of time in cyber years. However, no one - especially parents, will forget 2020's cyber lesson of the century. The only choice for teachers, guardians, and students was to learn through technology and virtual learning. For some across the country, it was an exceedingly difficult time. For others, it was an awakening of awareness for talented students who would flourish in the cyber world.

In 2003, the Alliance for Fort Gordon was established by Congressman Charlie Norwood to protect the community's interest during the Base Realignment and Closure Commission as well as becoming an advocate for Fort Gordon. In 2016 the mission evolved. adding the stimulation of investment in cyber growth and capitalizing on opportunities for all, eventually becoming the lead organization of the Fort Gordon Cyber District. By 2020, this was a nationally recognized destination for cyber work, life and play; covering counties in both Georgia and parts of South Carolina.

Executive Director of the Alliance for Fort Gordon, (Ret. Command Sergeant Major) Dr. Tom Clark, knows the importance of the future of cyber all too well. A 32-year retiree of the Army, who has acted as CSM of the 440th Signal Battalion in 2004 and Signal Task Force CSM of Iraq in 2006, is excited about his work in cyber. It is his passion. Alliance for Fort Gordon has programs such as a grant team they are part of providing free cyber training and job placement to veterans and military spouses (more on this program can be found at gaccworkforces.com) but also has joined with the Air Force Association (AFA) to host CyberPatriot Camp - a program for middle and high schoolers. CyberPatriot is the National Youth Cyber Education Program created by the AFA to inspire K-12 students toward careers in cybersecurity or other science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) disciplines critical to our nation's future. The CyberPatriot Programs include the National Youth Cyber Defense Competion, AFA Cybercamps, Elementary School Cyber Education Initiative, Cyber Education Literature Series, and Cybergenerations (more on these programs can be found at uscyberpatriot.org).

Alliance for Fort Gordon's Alliance for Cyber Education (ACE) CyberPatriot Camp offers two virtual sessions this summer; the Standard AFA Cybercamp and Advanced AFA Cybercamp. Although the Standard AFA Cybercamp has passed, there is still time to register for the Advanced AFA Cybercamp being held July 26th-30th, between 9am and 3pm.

The free camp hosts 75 campers. This week-long camp offers curriculum of Windows 10 Module, Ubuntu 16 Module and Cisco NetAcad and ending with a CyberPatriot competition day on Friday. The Air Force Association's CyberPatriot Program Office has announced the Fort Gordon Cyber District as the CyberPatriot Center of Excellence of the year for the second consecutive year in a row. The exceptional level of involvement across all areas of CyberPatriot made Fort Gordon stand out from other outstanding Centers of Excellence and continues to grow. With the help of the Fort Gordon Adopt-a-School program, the number of registered CyberPatriot teams in the area has increased from six teams to over 120 teams. ACE has conducted free CyberPatriot training for over 70 regional teachers at the Georgia Cyber Center and had participants of Cybercamps from 40 different schools.

Really there isn't a reason not to let your youth take part in this journey. Cyber is the future and this free camp is a great opportunity for our future leaders.

Upload the complete form and two forms of ID (driver's license, social security card, birth certificate and/or passport) to https://safe.apps.mil/ or bring to any MWR facility for processing.




